MEANINGFUL WAYS TO MAKE A LEGACY GIFT

BEQUESTS:

- One of the most common ways to provide an enduring gift of support is including a gift to New England Botanic Garden at Tower Hill in your will or trust. You can specify an amount, a percentage, or remainder of the estate or trust.
- This flexible option can be revised at any time and allows you to take care of your family and the causes you care about. For suggested bequest language to use, visit our website at nebglegacy.org.

BENEFICIARY DESIGNATIONS:

- You can name the Garden as the charitable beneficiary of your assets including an IRA plan, life insurance polcies, donor-advised funds, or bank accounts. Simply request and complete a beneficiary designation form from the administrator of your plan.
- Did you know that retirement assets count against estate tax and are heavily taxed when left to loved ones other than a spouse? But tax-exempt organizations, like New England Botanic Garden at Tower Hill, receive the full amount with no tax due! This allows you to make a larger impact for future generations to come.

PERSONAL PROPERTY:

Gifts of real estate offer an easy and tax efficient way to make a lasting contribution to the Garden. Your gift will help sustain the operations of the Gardens while also avoiding capital gains and reducing federal income tax.

IRA ROLLOVER:

- You can impact New England Botanic Garden at Tower Hill's mission and make a tax-free charitable gift by rolling over a portion of your IRA to the Garden. By doing so, you can satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year and avoid taxes on transfers of up to \$100,000 from your IRA to the Garden.
- To make a transfer, you must be age 70 and 1/2 or older. Transfers must be made directly from your IRA administrator to New England Botanic Garden at Tower Hill. Contact your administrator to rollover your IRA to charity, and reach out to us to speak more about this opportunity or to let us know to expect your gift.
